RHODE ISLAND TAX POLICY



Rhode Island tax law requires that all exhibitors provide documentation verifying their tax collection responsibilities

All exhibitors will fall into one of the following categories:

TAX EXEMPT

In the State of Rhode Island, boats are not taxable; neither are publications or services. If your company falls into one of these categories, you are not required to collect sales tax. In addition, non-profit organizations, exhibitors offering insurance or financial services, and exhibitors not making retail sales at the show are not required to collect sales tax. YOU MUST, HOWEVER, CHECK THE TAX EXEMPT BOX AND RETURN THIS FORM TO THE SHOW OFFICE INDICATING THAT YOU ARE TAX EXEMPT.

TAXABLE WITH RHODE ISLAND TAX PERMIT

Any company selling taxable products, and has a valid Rhode Island Sales Tax Permit, must provide a photocopy of the Sales Tax Permit.

TAXABLE WITHOUT RHODE ISLAND TAX PERMIT

Companies selling taxable products that do not have a valid Rhode Island Sales Tax Permit must obtain a Temporary Sales Tax Permit from Newport International Boat Show. If you fall into this category, check the appropriate box below and you will complete a P-498 Application at the Show Office provided to you upon check in.
